Kentucky Fencing Schools will be held on November 7 in Georgetown and November 9 in Princeton. These high-quality fencing workshops will focus on the proper construction of fixed knot woven wire and electrified smooth high tensile fencing. Participants will learn from fencing experts in the classroom in the morning and then experience fencing in the field with hands-on exercises and demonstrations following lunch. Beginning November 2, the University of Kentucky Martin-Gatton College of Agriculture,

Food and Environment will present a series of four webinars covering field crop protection. Hosted through the Southern Integrated Pest Management Center, the webinars will feature UK Extension Pest Management Specialists discussing plant pathology, weed science and entomology topics. The one-hour webinars will be held on Thursday mornings in November and will take place via Zoom at 10 AM EST/ 9 AM CST. Topics will be: Do multiple corn fungicide applications pay? What have we learned from nearly two decades of research on soybean with foliar fungicides? Managing the offensive spread of weeds, and Insects in field crops during two years of partial drought and heat wave.
